government has not taken any tough policy for the tobacco control. There is an argument of tobacco producer that tax increases will result in a significant loss of government revenue and impose an unfairly high tax burden on the poor.

The low price is one of the major factors underlying the increase in tobacco use despite the Tobacco Control Act. Cigarettes have become more affordable in recent years.

In Bangladesh there are number of campaigns like promoting oral saline, reducing tuberculosis quite successfully. However, in case of tobacco control, the scenario is quite dismal. Its campaign is still yet to reach sustainable effectiveness. There are many nongovernment organisations who have taken initiative in implementation of TCA which are still to become effective.

With this as the backdrop, MRDI will contribute to assess the existing policy factors in the country and will analyze and provide recommendations on how to change tobacco control policies in Bangladesh through identification of key policy actors, interviewing, political mapping, comprehensive media scanning and cases studies. An inclusive communication strategy will be developed through these assessments which will analyse the whole chain of the tobacco sector.
